PTA Meeting @ Reinhard 9/12/23 8pm

Jamie Shiner & Nikki Zimberg, co-presidents, bring the meeting to order and welcome parents, teachers and admins to the first meeting of the 2023/2024 school year.

Emily Slutsky, Recording Secretary, states that the meeting minutes will be posted on PTA website and whoever is interested/whoever misses a meeting can stay informed and check it out.

Kristen Wong-Valle, Treasurer, states that as of 8/31/23, the bank balance is \$104,07.59 and the book balance is \$96,432.80. Kristen reports that during this meeting we usually vote to approve the new budget. She offered the audience a copy of the 2023/2024 budget, if they had not already taken a copy when they signed in. She said all in favor of approving this budget "say yes," and multiple members said "yes." Then she asked "all who do not approve, say no," and no one said "no." Kristen said the motion passed and the 2023/2024 budget had been adopted and approved.

Jessica Freeman, Corresponding Secretary, said Mr. Reilly sent a thank you note to the PTA for the delicious and nutritious apples for the beginning of the year and a thank you note from Antonio Scimeca, for the JFK Scholarship.

Principals Report #1 from Mrs. Castine @ Reinhard:

She welcomed all new and returning families to Reinhard. She explained we were in the cafeteria where the children sit each day, surrounded by quotations on the wall, describing what a Star Polisher was and talking about what our core values are. She said our year was off to a great start and our community is friendly and supportive. She explained that the kindergarteners are already becoming more independent and are getting used to the routine of the school and are beginning to learn their way around the building on their own. Next, she spoke about the dismissal routine and how important it is to let the office know if you are making a change to your child's dismissal plan for that day. You must email the office by 2:15pm on the day you are making the change to let them know about it. We don't want your child winding up in the wrong spot! Next, she discussed Bellmore character education and being in charge of yourself. Making good decisions and hitting the pause button. She said each class is starting to make the morning announcements in the school over the loudspeaker. By the end of the year, each class will have made the morning announcements twice. Some kids do not choose to participate in this, and that is ok because we let them choose what they are comfortable with doing. Mrs. Castine stated that by the end of September or early October, each class will be posting their mission statement outside their room, and Mr. Reillys class was the first one to do so! The main office

has already posted theirs, as well. We are also working on setting long term and short term goals, meaning what do we want to work on achieving? The "Catch a Rising Star Board" from last year is still up, but on 10/13 at the Pep Rally, it will be taken down and we will prepare for the new one. Then, she stated that she sends home or emails the "Reinhard Record," which is the school's newsletter that she puts together and it contains the school's important information. Important dates are as follows...10/5 and 10/6 are picture days and a flier will be sent home. 10/11 and 10/12 is the book fair, 10/19 is the pumpkin patch, and 10/31 is the halloween character parade. More information will follow in the mail. She reminded all parents to check their child's folders every night and she thanked all teachers, staff, and custodians for a great start to the year.

## Principals Report #2 by Mrs. Curto @ Winthrop:

She welcomed everyone to the meeting and said we have had a great start to the school year so far and said the building had a great Back to School Night last night, 9/11. She discussed the core values of integrity and the leadership principle of being proactive. She discussed how the teachers give the students goals and help them find ways of achieving these goals. Students have classroom leadership roles but also building leadership roles to help them learn about responsibility. She explained that we teach the children about positive language and teach them about being in charge of themselves. On 8/28/23, some 4th graders led the building tours for incoming 3rd graders and Mrs. Curto received so many compliments from parents afterwards about how mature the students were and how smoothly the tours were run. She gave "Kudos" to the Star Polisher team who ran these tours. Mrs. Curto said they have a very busy October coming up. Health and Safety week, Garden Club will be starting, as well as this year's book fair. ## Principals Report #3 by Mrs. Matthews @ Shore Road:

She welcomed everyone and gave a thank you for the apples on the first day of school. She said it was the first time in four years with no chaos during the building opening (COVID/road construction)! She said the 5th graders settled right in and the 6th graders already went on a trip to Project Adventure, which is all about teamwork and building classroom culture. She said the 6th grade Committee is already meeting to discuss events such as the in-school Cornhole Competition and Garden Club is starting up again which is super exciting!
